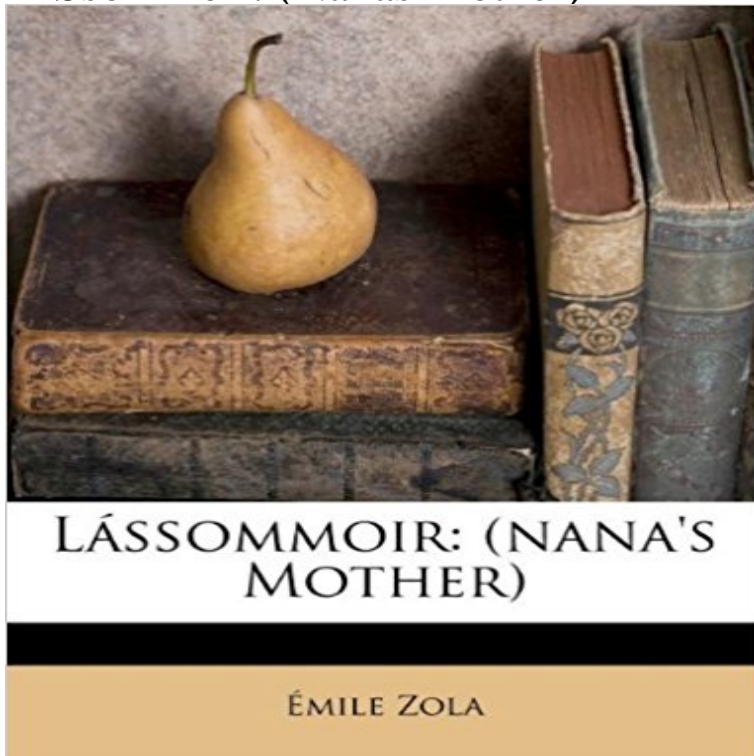


L Ssommoir: (Nanas Mother)
